In my last letter we were just about to have an- in school training session on OFSTED inspection. We knew that an inspection would happen soon so the training was very useful; increasing our awareness of what aspects of governance the inspectors were likely to ask us about. Edward put together a list of possible questions so we were able to review our documents and ensure that we knew where to find relevant information; we were well prepared when the inspectors did come to school in February.

Recently John, Rev Jane and I attended a course, Youthscape Essentials, at Caton St Pauls. Mrs Entwistle and other members of our Benefice churches were also on the course. It was led by a very enthusiastic youth worker, Rachel Gardner and, although more focused on teenagers than primary school children it was a very interesting day on how to relate to young people and engage them with Bible stories.

In January joined a Diocese training session on The Distinctive Role of Governors in a Church School. Led by Liz Agbettoh, School Effectiveness Officer; it was a chance to explore how our Church School characteristics impact our leadership.

The Spring Chairs Forum focused on Inclusion; looking at the LCC provision for pupils with Special Education needs. Work is being done to provide more places and extra support for pupils with additional needs.

In March I attended the Chairs Conference; this year held in person at Preston County hall. The theme was 'When the Going gets Tough'. We had a lecture on resilience and managing our own wellbeing, something that is important for us all, governors, staff and families. The afternoon lecture was titled leadership1 Management 0, (the lecturer had a background of football management), we were learning about the role of Governors as leaders rather than managers. Lots of information that we will be discussing in our upcoming meetings to ensure our school has a clear vision for the future.
